





Tenebrae Service


One of my favourite services of the wonderful Holy Week narrative we commemorate here at St. Peter's is the Good Friday evening service of Tenebrae. Meaning 'darkness' or 'shadows' this service was originally celebrated in the early morning Offices (Matins and Lauds) on the last three days of Holy Week. The services were centred around readings about the betrayal, crucifixion, agony and death of Jesus, symbolised by the gradual extinguishing of candles. An important part of the service was known as the 'strepitus', or 'great noise', which represented the earthquake that followed Christ's death.

The service was (re-?) introduced to St. Peter's by Dean Jan Joustra, perhaps 15 years ago, and has been a choir favourite ever since. The readings are so dramatic and emotionally powerful, and have inspired equally impactful music over many centuries. Bairstow's setting of "The Lamentations of the prophet Jeremiah," John Sanders' beautifully excruciating "The Reproaches" and many exquisite settings of Renaissance polyphony by the likes of Palestrina, Vittoria and Gesualdo provide an abundance of riches from which to select appropriate music to accentuate the Gospel accounts of this




central part of our faith. After each reading, a candle is extinguished as the choir sing, throwing the church into deeper darkness. By the end of the service, only the Christ candle remains, to show the impact of the light of Christ when all seems dark. At this point, our Tenebrae service seems to follow what the Lutherans do – like in our Cantata Vespers services – and the Christ candle is hidden, rather than extinguished. After the 'strepitus,' the Christ candle is restored – the one light in the church – and the congregation leaves in silence, unsatisfied but prepared for the next part of the Holy Week narrative.

If you haven't attended the Tenebrae service before, I strongly encourage you to attend this year:
Good Friday, 7pm.


